Obituary

The Christmas season was made more joyous when Victor Lunderman arrived on December 27, 1932. He was the youngest child born to Victoria Demar Lunderman and Lee Lunderman, Sr, in Indianapolis, Indiana. He was raised in a Godly, sharing and loving home where a strong work ethic prevailed, was demonstrated and taught.

Victor was educated in Indianapolis public schools. Upon graduation from Crispus Attucks High School he was enrolled at Tuskegee Institute, which later became Tuskegee University in Tuskegee, Alabama. He was initiated in 1948 as part of the "charter line" of the Beta Kappa Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. Upon graduating, he was commissioned as a 2nd LT in the US Army and served 3 years as an Infantry Officer. After which, he enrolled at the University of Southern California in the Physical Therapy Program. Victor retired as a Physical Therapist from the Veterans Administration Hospital in Dayton, OH after 31 years of service.

Victor, affectionately known to family as, "Lucien", married his childhood sweetheart and love of his life, Frances Quarles in May 1952 and they were blessed with greater than 69 years of marriage, six children, ten grandchildren, and six great grandchildren.

Victor loved God, his family and helping others. He enjoyed teaching and learning from others, traveling, taking pictures, and gardening. He was a devoted member of Wayman A.M.E. Church for over 50 years. In that time, he served as a Trustee, Sunday School Teacher, Security, Maintenance, Kitchen and Transportation Committees and in the choir for special occasions. Victor was also an active member of the Dayton Tuskegee Alumni Club where he served as a former club President and Parliamentarian.
